

Formerly on Grounds Known as Part of the Crystal Lode

Notice of Location of Quartz or Rock in Place Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned Citizens of the United States have discovered a vein or lode of Quartz, or other Rock, in Place Bearing Gold and Silver, and in accordance with the laws of the United States and the laws of the State of California, state:

First - That the name of said lode or claim is "New Era" Lode Mining Claim.

Second - That the names of the locators are F. H. Beik and John Kinkaid.

Third - That the number of linear feet claimed in length along the course of the vein each way from the point of discovery is 750 feet Northward and 750 feet Southward and the width of the vein or lode is three hundred feet on either side thereof, measured from the center line of the vein at the surface.

Fourth - That the said mine was located on the first day of January, A. D. 1911.

Fifth - That the description of said claim is made by reference to some natural object or permanent monument as will identify the claim located as follows, to-wit: Near or adjoining the Western side line of the "Joe" lode claim, one of the Burlington Group of claims owned by Weston, and patented under U. S. Patent Ser. No. , and also about one half mile Westward from the Post Office at Forbestown, and situated in the Forbestown Mining District, Butte County, State of California, this being a location upon a portion of the ground formerly claimed by H. J. Clark and H. L. Burton, in the year 1908 as the Crystal Lode and now subject to location. This claim being 600 feet in width and 1500 feet in length and running with the apex and outcropping of the said vein and being 300 feet in width on each side of the center of said vein.
