Forest Ranch Couple Killed As Auto Plunges Into Canal

OROVILLE (E-R) — An elderly Forest Ranch couple was killed yesterday when their automobile flipped over into an irrigation canal after smashing through a bridge railing on the Richvale South Road.

Roy Rex Brooks, 67, and his wife, Elese Pauline Brooks, 69, were believed dead when the auto was pulled from the water a short time later. The accident occurred shortly before noon.

An attempt by Ernest L. Evans and Albert Hamblin, ages unknown, both of Richvale, to rescue the two victims from the submerged vehicle proved fruitless.

The California Highway Patrol said Evans and Hamblin were unable to open the right door of the automobile because of the strong current in the canal and the general wrecked condition of the car.

Evans and Hamblin were in the water when the CHP arrived.

A tractor was brought to the scene within five minutes after the CHP arrived and the vehicle was pulled from the water.

Only the rear bumper and the gas tank of the submerged automobile were visible in the water. It was the opinion of the CHP that both were dead when the vehicle was pulled from the canal.

The CHP said the southbound vehicle left the road while attempting to overtake and pass a truck driven by Kenneth J. Lee, 54, of Richvale.

It traveled about 112 feet with the left wheels off the road before smashing into the northeast corner of the bridge. Four posts, measuring 8x8 inches were busted and knocked into the air by the impact.

Two men standing on the northwest corner of the bridge witnessed the accident. Wallace D. Craig, 22, of Biggs, and John M. Murray, 48, of Tustin said the car struck the railing and flipped over in the air, landing on its top in the canal.

The truck driver became aware of the accident when he saw pieces of the bridge railing flying through the air. At first

he thought he had lost a part of his load.

The couple was driving a 1958 model two-door sedan, which one of the witnesses estimated was traveling about "40 miles per hour" when it struck the bridge.

The county owned bridge is located north of the intersection of the Butte City road. The canal is the property of the Richvale Irrigation District.

According to CHP measurements, the road pavement is 19 feet wide at the point where the left wheels left the road. The bridge is 26 feet, 2 inches wide.

The CHP noted that the two men who attempted to rescue the two victims trapped in the totally damaged vehicle should be commended for their efforts.

Funeral services for the couple will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Thursday at the Brusie Funeral Home. Burial will be in the Cherokee Cemetery.

Brooks was born in Centerville on April 6, 1898 and had spent his entire life in this area. Until one and one-half years ago he had owned and operated a dairy ranch on Stanford Lane in Durham. He was a veteran of World War I.

Mrs. Brooks was born in Oregon City on June 23, 1895.

Their survivors include the following children: Jack Graves of Phoenix; Ira Graves of Bridgeville; Chester Graves of Durham; Mrs. Verda Danker of Durham; Mrs. Emma Richardson of Redding and Mrs. Ruth Bateman of Forest Ranch; 18 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.

Kathryn Forbes McLean, author of "Mama's Bank Account," basis of the movie, "I Remember Mama," who died in San Francisco May 15, was a niece of the late Mrs. J. Everett Morrow of 130 W. Third Ave.

When she was five years old, she spent the winter in Chico with Mr. and Mrs. Morrow at the U. S. Plant Garden, of which Morrow was then superintendent.

"She cried every night for her mother," Morrow remembers.

Her father was Lee Anderson of Forbestown whose mother was a Forbes and her mother was Della Jessen, who was a sister of Mrs. Morrow, who was Grace Louise Jessen before her marriage to Morrow.

The family lived in San Francisco, where Anderson was a builder and Mrs. Anderson ran a big boarding house. "Mama's Bank Account" was Kathryn Anderson McLean's recollections of those boarding house days.

Known professionally as Kathryn Forbes, Mrs. McLean began her writing career in 1941 with a short story, 'Mama and Her Bank Account' that appeared in the Reader's Digest," reported the San Francisco Chronicle the other day when she died.

"Mama's Bank Account," a novel, developed from this. The book became the play, "I Re-

member Mama," then a movie and finally a television series, "Mama."

"In domestic and overseas editors," said the Chronicle, "Mama's Bank Account" sold an estimated 3.5 million copies and was used by the United States government during and after World War II as an example of American life at its best."

Mrs. McLean's husband was the late Robert McLean. She and he made their home in Burlingame for many years. Since 1962 she had been ill of pulmonary emphysema said was confined to Mount Zion Hospital in San Francisco. She was buried in Holy Cross Cemetery at Burlingame.
