He graduated from Lodi Academy in 1930 and received an accounting degree from Armstrong Schools of Business in 1939.

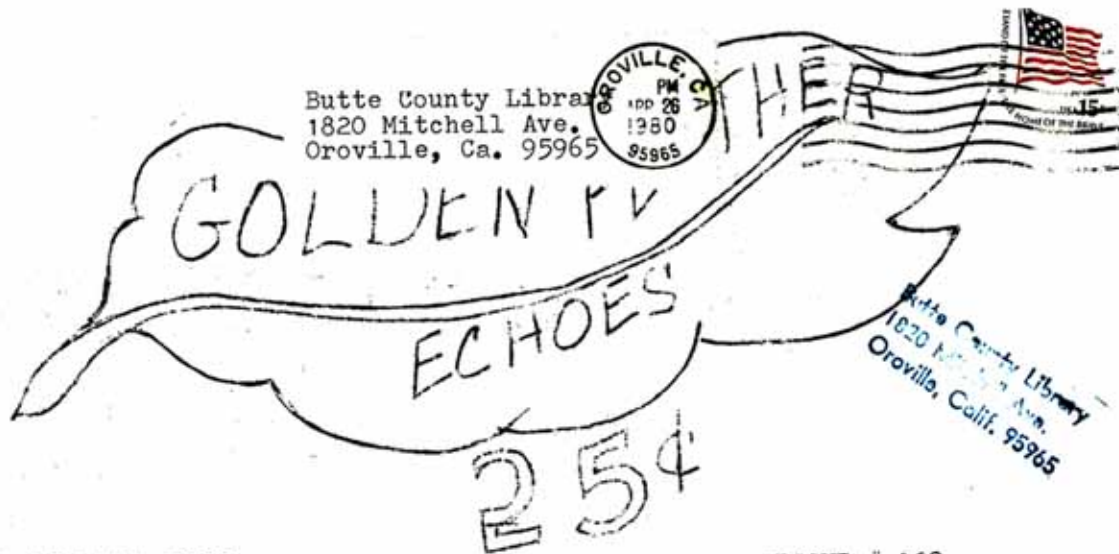
