Butte County Ends Lost Youth Search

OROVILLE (UPI) — Butte County authorities have discontinued an underwater search for a missing Modesto youth believed to have drowned in a freak camping accident over the weekend.

Dale Caldeira, 19, is thought to have drowned after the truck he was sleeping in rolled into Oroville Lake and sank in 100 feet of water.

Caldeira and 18-year-old Kenneth Blansit, also of Modesto, were sleeping in Blansit's pickup truck on the shore of the lake Friday night when authorities said the truck rolled into the lake.

Blansit escaped but became disoriented. He swam to the opposite side of the inlet and had to walk several miles before he found someone to summon help.

Officials said they presume Caldeira is dead but they also said he could have made it out and gotten lost in the woods.

Blaze Cause Known

JARBO GAP (E-R) — The cause of a Wednesday structure fire in the Jarbo Gap area northeast of Oroville, which claimed the life of a 5-month-old infant, was faulty wiring, said California Department of Forestry officials.

The 7 a.m. fire in which Squire Clayborn died destroyed the single-wide mobile home. The child resided there with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jackie Clayborn.

Fire investigators estimated total damages to the structure and its contents at \$35,000.

The mobile home was located 19 miles northeast of Oroville off Highway 70, behind the Rock House restaurant.

Five Butte County engines were dispatched to the fire and contained the blaze in about an hour. The home was fully engulfed in flames when firefighters arrived.

The infant's mother, Shellee, 17, was in the home when the fire broke out and reportedly sustained burns on her hands, but there was no record of her being treated at any area hospital. The father was outside at the time of the fire.

Boy's Body Found After Boat Crash

Authorities said an autopsy would be conducted to determine whether Eric Felthouse of Yankee Hill drowned or was killed by a ski boat that struck his fishing boat Aug. 23.

Findings in the autopsy will be turned over to the Butte County district attorney to determine whether charges will be filed against Gregory Miller, 26, of San Jose, driver of the ski boat.

Felthouse was fishing with his mother and father when their boat was hit by Miller's craft, officials said. His parents survived, but the youth disappeared.

Brother Held In Slaying Of Oroville Man

BERRY CREEK, Butte Co. — A 31-year-old Oroville man is being held on investigation of murder in the fatal shooting of his older brother, deputies reported.

Sheriff's investigators said they still haven't established a motive in a Monday night slaying on a country road near Berry Creek.

The victim, Darrell R. Edwards, 34, of Oroville, died of a single large-

caliber gunshot wound in the chest, deputies reported. The shooting followed a quarrel between the victim and David R. Edwards, 31, according to sheriff's reports.

An 8-year-old Oroville girl was killed and two other persons seriously injured when their car was slammed broadside after pulling in front of a truck last night, the CHP said.

Trisha Lynn Holdiman, who was sitting in the right front seat of the 1976 Ford LTD, was killed outright in the 10:35 p.m. accident at Durham-Pentz and Clark roads, the CHP said.

Lisa Mastromatteo, 21, of 1630 Park Drive, Magalia, seated in the center of the front seat, suffered major injuries, officers said.

A spokesman at Enloe Hospital in Chico today said the woman's condition is still "very critical." She is in the trauma unit at the hospital.

The driver of the Ford,

Clifford Earl Nimz, 54, of Route 1, Box 242H, Oroville, also suffered severe injuries, the CHP said. The hospital spokesman confirmed that Nimz is a patient at Enloe, but said a request had been made not to release any other information about him, not even a medical condition.

Eric Charles Pawson, 35, of Milpitas, the truck driver, was not injured, officers said.

The CHP has ruled out the use of alcohol by either driver, an officer said today, but an investigation into the cause of the accident was continuing.

It appeared, one officer said, that Nimz was driving eastbound on Durham-Pentz, stopped at the stop

sign at Clark Road, then merely pulled into the path of the oncoming truck, possibly without seeing it.

The truck was northbound and struck the Ford in the right side. It did leave skid marks in an attempt to stop, but the skid measurements and other aspects of the CHP investigation were not available today.

Trish, a native of Oroville, was born Feb. 27, 1974. Among her survivors are her stepfather and mother, Clifford and Tressie Nimz, Oroville, and her father, Richard Holdiman, in the Navy and stationed in Honolulu.

Arrangements for the little girl were pending today at Scheer Memorial Chapel in Oroville.

Accident victim dies of injuries

A woman injured in a two-vehicle accident Wednesday night died Thursday night in a Chico hospital.

Lisa Mastromatteo, 21, of Magalia was pronounced dead at 10 p.m. Thursday by doctors in the trauma unit at Enloe Hospital. She became the second victim to die from injuries received in the crash, which occurred at Clark and Durham-Pentz roads, near Butte College.

Miss Mastromatteo and Trisha Lynn Holdiman, 8, of Oroville were passengers in Nimz' car. The girl was pronounced dead at the accident scene, the CHP said.

Nimz was listed in fair condition today by officials at Enloe Hospital.

The driver of the truck, Eric Charles Pawson, 35, of Milpitas, Alameda County, was not injured.
