SEA GIRT — Catharine A. Yard, president of the American Timber Co. Inc., Sea Girt, died Thursday at Jersey Shore Medical Center, Neptune, from complications due to pneumonia. She was 48.

The American Timber Co. was founded by her grandfather, H.H. Yard, in 1893. The company was responsible for developing land in Belmar, Spring Lake and Manasquan.

Yard began working for the family-owned business in 1968 and assumed the presidency of in 1990.

Her responsibilities for the company included land acquisition and serving as a liaison among the Yard family, stockholders, and professional staff.

Family spokesman Michael Cherenon said Yard's death came as a complete shock to friends and to the family.

"The family is pretty well devastated by her loss, but with such strong family ties, I am sure they will be there for each other," Cherenon said.

Business decisions made by the American Timber Co. have always been family decisions and this process will undoubtedly remain in place, he said.

American Timber deeded a large section of the beach to Manasquan in the 1930s for \$1, and still has real estate interests in the area, most notably 25 acres on the Fisherman's Cove tract in Manasquan.

Yard had just attended a meeting last weekend with several Manasquan officials and residents to resolve a beachfront issue and borough officials expressed surprise and shock at her death.

"She was always a very fair person to deal with and, although we have had differences of opinion in the past, she always gave the borough a fair hearing on any issue," Manasquan Mayor John L. Winterstella said.

"She will be very deeply missed, and on behalf of the municipality I would like to extend our heartfelt sympathy to her family. It's just such a shock and a it's a very sad day in this community," he said.

Yard was a member of the Shore Christian Center, Wall Township. She attended Yuba College in Marysville, Calif., and Chico State College, Chico, Calif. She was born in Point Pleasant and lived in Sea Girt most of her life.

Surviving are a son, Michael Saito, Brielle; three daughters, Michelle, Mikiko and Mary Catharine Saito, all of Sea Girt; her mother, Dorothy Yard, who continues as company chairperson; four brothers, Richard Yard, Jackson Township; Stephen Yard, Oroville, Calif.; Carl A. Yard Jr., Wall, and William C. Yard, Modesto, Calif.; two sisters, Victoria Steiner, Seattle, and Elizabeth Rasmussen, Chico, Calif., and two grandchildren.
