Frank L. Donati, 54, died Tuesday, June 29, 1993, at Oroville Hospital.

He was born Aug. 27, 1938, in Westwood. He had been a resident of Oroville for three weeks. He was raised and attended schools in Westwood, graduating from Westwood High in 1956. He earned his degree in forestry from Lassen Jr. College in Susanville.

He had served with the U.S. Army at Camp Hanford in Richland, Wash. After his military service he fell timber and attended the University of Nevada, Reno and was also a guest lecturer there. He worked for the Soil Conservation Service mapping soils in the Sierra Nevada Mountains and Nevada desert. He then worked as a deputy appraiser for Washoe County Nevada. In 1975 he moved to Richfield, Idaho and worked as an independent appraiser. He had worked as a land agent for Idaho Power Co. from 1976-1991, he was also a troubleshooter, negotiator and a Right of Way appraiser. While living in Oroville (between 1970-75) he had worked for Butte County as a timber and rural land appraiser.

He was a member of Rural Appraisers and Farm Managers Association, the Right of Way Association, Catholic Church and the Italian American Club of Boise, Idaho.

He is survived by his wife Claudia of Oroville; his son Greg of Oroville; his parents Mr. and Mrs. Greg Donati; his sister Sandra Theiss; his aunts; his niece and nephew; his two grand nieces and many cousins.

Alrae Olsen

Alrae Olsen, a fighter pilot in World War II and a long-time Santa Rosa resident, died Jan. 15 of cancer. He was 72.

Olsen was born into a pioneer California family. One side of the family came to California from St. Louis before the Gold Rush and owned ranches in the Chico area.

On the other side of the family, Olsen's grandfather was a saloon keeper in San Jose, and his father, Raymond Olsen, was a newspaper reporter in Modesto who later worked in advertising in Santa Rosa.

Olsen was born in San Jose, but moved to Santa Rosa as a child with his mother and father. He attended Santa Rosa schools and Santa Rosa Junior College before accepting a basketball scholarship at San Jose State University.

When World War II broke out, Olsen enlisted in the Navy, in the aviation program. He attended flight school in Corpus Christi, Texas, and married his wife Wilma in a traditional military ceremony on the same day he got his wings.

Olsen taught for a time at the Naval Air Station in Livermore and then was stationed aboard the USS Essex in the South Pacific. The Essex was known as "the fightingest ship in the Navy" and Olsen saw active duty in the major South Pacific battles, as a fighter pilot and flight deck commander.

After the war, he returned to Santa Rosa and worked for a short time at the county airport. He then worked at the Sonoma County Assessor's Office for about 10 years and subsequently administered the home loan program for the California Department of Veterans' Affairs for more than 20 years.

After his retirement, Olsen and his wife worked as volunteers at the Sonoma County Public Library, donating one day a week of their time for more than 13 years. The couple were honored recently for their volunteer work.

Olsen was a man devoted to his family and one of his great joys in later years was to travel with his wife to the ocean to watch the whales and seabirds, said his son, Stephen Olsen.

He is survived by his mother, Ruth Olsen; his wife, Wilma Olsen; and two sons, Stephen R. Olsen and Lawrence L. Olsen, all of Santa Rosa.

At his request, no services were held. Private inurnment was at Santa Rosa Memorial Park.
