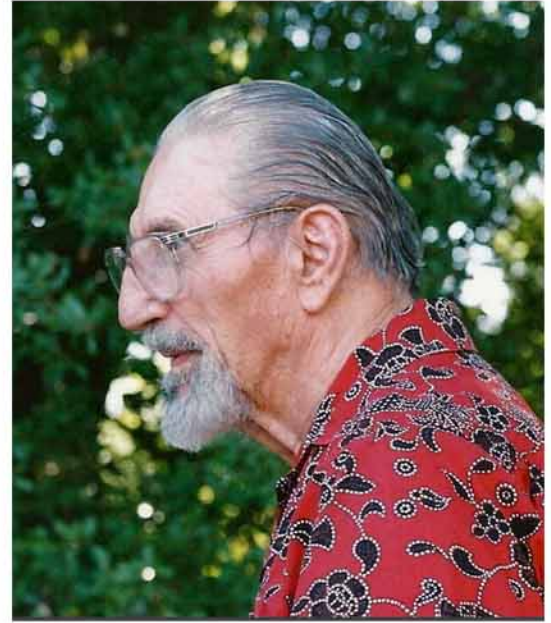

He died Wednesday, February 6th, 2002 at a Chico convalescent hospital. He was born to the Italian immigrant family of Ernesto and Emilia Galli in Sacramento, California, on November 29th, 1913.

Jim's mechanical gift was obvious even as a young boy. He received his education and acquired his millwright training in the Sacramento area. He joined the Seabees in 1943 and served in the Pacific areas of Japan and Okinawa aboard the repair ship U.S.S. Pandemus.
